

# What do I do after I get my Court Decree?

## **Social Security**

- Print a copy of the SS-5 Form (page 5)
- · Bring the original stamped copy of your court decree
- Take completed documents to your local Social Security office
- Have additional documentation to prove your identity
- You do not need gender affirming surgery to update your gender marker in CA

#### Information at the DMV

- To update your NAME
  - Complete the <u>DL-44</u> online (paper forms are available at your local DMV office)
  - You will need supporting documentation, like your court decree
- To update your LICENSE TO A REAL ID
  - You need an original birth certificate and court decree or amended birth certificate, and other <u>supporting</u> documentation

### **Passport**

- If your current passport is < one year old</li>
  - Complete <u>Passport Re-Application</u> <u>Form</u> (<u>DS-5504</u>)
  - Include certified copy of court decree (original stamped copy of your court decree)
  - Pay passport application fee
- If your current passport is > one year old
  - Complete <u>Passport Re-Application</u> <u>Form</u> (DS-82)
  - Include certified copy of court decree (original stamped copy of your court decree)
  - Pay passport application fee

#### **Birth Certificate**

- To update your NAME ONLY
  - Get VS-23 Official Form
  - Include original stamped copy of your court decree and \$26 fee
  - Mail to the office of Vital Records
  - Amended birth certificate will be issued
- To update your NAME and GENDER MARKER
  - Get <u>VS-24B Official Form and</u> instructions
  - Include original stamped copy of your court decree and \$26 fee
  - Mail to the office of Vital Records
  - New birth certificate will be issued (old one will be sealed)

  - College Applications
